Road Safety Sessions

Last month, our Reception and Year 5 pupils took part in engaging road safety sessions delivered by the Safer Essex Roads Partnership.

Reception Highlights:

Reception pupils with their parents and carers, enjoyed a practical activity using a large-scale road and pavement mat. This helped them learn:

- We must hold hands with a grown-up near roads.

The importance of staying safe around traffic learning to Stop, Look, Listen, Think!

Year 5 Highlights:

Year 5 pupils participated in a hands-on session designed to build confidence and promote safe, independent travel. They explored:

- The Green Cross Code: Stop, Look, Listen, Think!
- The dangers of distractions like phones, headphones, and friends.

How to identify safer places to cross.

With guidance from trained road safety officers, they practiced real-life road crossing skills.

How You Can Help at Home:

You can support these lessons by:

- Modelling safe habits when walking near roads
- Holding hands with younger children

Road Safety Starts with You

As parents and carers, you play the most important role in helping children learn how to stay safe. Young children copy what they see - so the way you cross the road, drive, or use your phone near traffic teaches them lifelong habits.

Helping your child stay safe near roads

Here are **three ways** to help keep your child safe:



1. Hold hands

Always hold your child's hand when walking near roads- young children can be unpredictable - holding hands keeps them close and safe. Always position children on the side of the path that is furthest from the road.



2. Teach the Green Cross Code

Start practising this with your child early, even if they're still small. It builds confidence and awareness. Talk to them about why you:

- **Stop** at the edge of the pavement.
- **Look** all around for traffic.
- **Listen** carefully for approaching vehicles.
- **Think** - is it safe to cross?



3. Be a great role model

But your actions speak louder than words. Children learn by watching how you:

- Use crossings and wait for the green man.
- Avoid distractions like mobile phones when walking or driving.
- Park safely and legally, not on pavements or near junctions.
- Wear seatbelts and use car seats correctly.

The rules

Electrically powered scooters are being seen increasingly in our towns and cities, both rental scheme and privately owned scooters. You can ride on our roads legally within designated areas if you have hired an e-scooter from an approved rental scheme. However, the same is not true for privately-owned e-scooters.

Under current legislation, you can only ride a privately owned e-scooter on private land with the landowner's permission. It means you cannot ride it in any public area, including roads, foot paths and parks. If you are using a private e-scooter in any public place, police can seize it and you could also be liable for prosecution for traffic offences and even receive points on your driving licence because, like other motor vehicles, they are subject to traffic law.

Risks include:

- Lack of maintenance affecting braking and tyre performance.
- Charging of devices in the home introduces fire risk, especially if batteries have become damaged or wet.
- Scooters can easily over balance on bumps or holes due to their small wheels.
- Handling can be unpredictable, especially when reacting to hazards.
- There can be a temptation to ride while intoxicated or distracted.



Renting

A number of rental schemes have been set up in towns and cities in the UK, including Chelmsford, Braintree, and Colchester through a contract with Essex County Council. These schemes allow people to use rented e-scooters legally.

To use these schemes, you must:

- Be aged 18 or over.
- Hold a UK driving licence.
- Only ride on roads and cycle-paths within the hire scheme areas, pavement riding is not permitted.
- Not carry passengers or allow others to use a scooter you have hired. Wearing a helmet is highly recommended, and riders have the same responsibility to obey traffic laws as anyone driving a car.

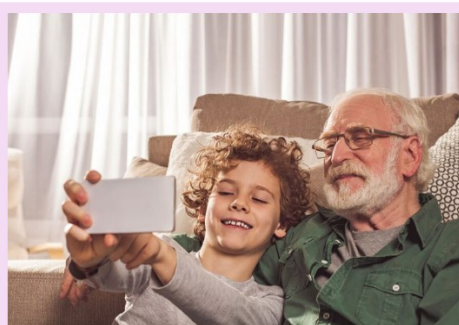

School Car Park

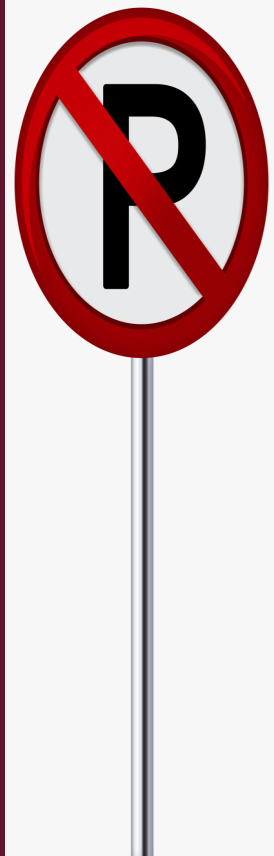
We kindly remind all families that the staff car park is not to be used for drop-off or pick-up at any time, including during Breakfast Club and After School Clubs.
